# Due to Good Weather



## HAWK TALK JIM'S MARQUART CHARGER TAKES SHAPE

Jim Henley's latest project is a 1/4 scale Marquart Charger Biplane. This beautiful plane is coming together nicely as you can see in this installment.

With the radio, ignition, installation, locations determined, time to turn to covering the aircraft.

All the structure is covered with 21st Century Fabric, this is a paint impregnated cloth that handles quite easily. Orange and Red trim is also done with 21st Century Fabric, while the cowl, wheel pants and struts being painted with Top Flite Luster Kote. The black striping is Great Planes striping tape. I used as large sections as practicable, to minimize seams and wrinkles. Trim was done likewise but has more sectioning of the material to facilitate handling and covering of the curved sections. In order to match trim on opposite sides, I cut templates for consistency, and when possible cut opposite sides at the same time, by cutting through two layers of covering.



The air frame is covered, the bottom wing is attached to the fuselage and the stabilizer has been checked to make sure it is square with the wing. Robart hinge points were used on the horizontal and vertical stabilizers and epoxied into place. With that done, the control rods were fabricated and control horns added



to the control surfaces and trims are centered and control surfaces are set to a neutral position. More to come! - Jim Henlev

## DAN'S LATEST PROJECT IS BIG, REALLY BIG!

This latest creation from Dan Walz is a **huge** B17. He has been working on it for over a year and it is finally starting to take the shape of the real thing. If it is anything like the B29 he built, it will be hard to tell the difference between the finished airplane and the real thing. I am sure we all look forward to seeing more of it as he completes it.

After cutting the parts in 2002, and actually starting to build it in December.of 2007, I met a milestone where the fuselage and wing have finally met. I just had to trim a little off the center rear of wing to fit, that only took a half hour, but it took 6 hours to align it. Finally, after breaking out the 3 beam laser, the wing is square to the fuse-lage and wing incidence is right on.

I weighed everything that I know is going into the plane, I'm at 44 lbs 6 oz. With the crew and fuel on top of that, I feel comfortable that it will be under 48 pounds total.
